



Refraction Service and Fee

One of the most important parts of your eye exam is the **refraction**. This test tells your **eye** doctor exactly what prescription you need in your glasses or contact lenses. It will help your doctor determine your best possible vision. This information is essential to determining the health of your eyes.

As of January 2018, the refraction fee is not covered by Most insurance companies. *There are some insurance companies that will pay for the refraction as long as the individual has not had a billed refraction within 12 -24 months. The insurance MUST BE THE PATIENTS PRIMARY, NOT SECONDARY. Listed are these insurance companies:

- 1. AETNA-MEDICARE**
- 2. UNITED HEALTHCARE MEDICARE**

Any patient is welcome to call their insurance company to verify if they will make payment for refraction. The CPT code is 92015, when calling your insurance company.

Our office fee for refraction is \$40; this fee is collected at the time of service in addition to any co-payments your plan may require.
